Instil our British Values including diversity:

- Books are carefully selected to incorporate a central character who encompasses themes of diversity and inclusion.
- Reading spines have been developed to ensure children broaden their views and perceptions of modern Britain.

Develop Resilience & Resourcefulness:

- Spelling is taught to allow children to develop resilience in making associations with different sounds.
- High expectations are set in all areas of the English curriculum.
- Children have access to English support stations to enable them to be successful learners.

Inspire critical thinking and independence:

- Writing a range of genres enables children to consider audience and purpose.
- Every child is a reader and encouraged to read challenging texts with thoughtful themes.
- Reading spines have been developed to ensure children broaden their views and perceptions of modern Britain and perceptions are challenged and explored.

Create articulate learners:

- Children have ample opportunities to become articulate speakers, readers and writers.
- Speaking and listening opportunities enable children to articulate their thinking, through debating, drama and performance opportunities.

- English texts are linked to the wider curriculum.
